	Phase 6 At this stage children should be able to spell words phonemically although not always correctly. In Phase Six the main aim is for children to become more fluent readers and more accurate spellers.

Key Stage 2 teachers (especially year 3 teachers who are explicitly trained to teach phonics) will continue to teach phonics to children who have gaps in their knowledge beyond Year 3 and will prompt children to use their phonics knowledge to decode new and tricky words.
