**Water bottles and packed lunches:**

All children must bring in a water bottle, clearly labelled with their name. Please encourage your child to take responsibility for remembering their water bottle every day.

Those children who are bringing a packed lunch should bring this in a small container, ideally a lunch box, as these will be stored within the classroom. Please also ensure your child is able to open the box and any food packages and containers, particularly flasks. We are a healthy eating school, so lunches should be nutritious and balanced, with no junk food items. Nuts and foods containing nuts are strictly prohibited.

**Medicines**

Please keep us updated with any changes to your child's medical needs. If your child requires an inhaler, EpiPen, or any other regular medication, please could you ensure the school has two of each medication from day one as we will require one for the classroom and one for the school medical room.

**PE and clothing**

We will be continuing with outdoor PE, dance with Daisy and the Daily Mile this term, so we would like to remind parents to ensure children are wearing clothing and footwear that is safe and appropriate for physical activity. As it is still fairly cold, please ensure that your child comes to school with a coat that is labelled with their name.
